This work concluded and results were delivered to the Community Working Group, who is moving the community governance efforts forward.

- In addition to our usual review of monthly financial statements, the finance committee has reviewed the draft 990 and financial audit performed by McDonald Jacobs and been working on a Weather Report which will supplement the monthly financial statements with the goal of making it easier for the board and the public to understand in the financials in context and to evaluate performance over time.

Executive Summary

Highlights:

Since our last public board meeting in June 2017, The staff has moved many things forward.

- **New marketing resources thanks to Srijan.** We are incredibly thankful to Srijan, a long time Drupal supporter who added to their long list of contributions this year by donating a full time marketing person to the Drupal Association. Piyush Jain has been working with the Drupal Association since January and has made a significant impact with DrupalCon marketing. [Thank you, Srijan.](#)
- **DrupalCon Vienna:** DrupalCon is a big team effort and much of our time this summer has gone towards producing and promoting the event. Ticket sales came in less than projected. However, we are managing variable and fixed costs to avoid taking on more of a loss with this event.
- **Drupal.org General Updates:** Since June, we've made a number of improvements in different areas of Drupal.org, including:
 - Launching the [Healthcare industry page](#), to highlight Drupal success stories in Healthcare
 - Adding semantic labels for development branches, allowing testing to be configured against 'current stable release' or 'default development branch' - saving project maintainers from having to chase core.
 - Issue sorting by the timestamp of the last status change, allowing users to sort [RTBC issues on a first-in/first-out basis](#).
 - A new area to promote case studies from supporting partners and top contributors on the [home page](#).
 - An audit of our monitoring and backup procedures, with the help of our new infrastructure vendor... speaking of which:
- **Drupal.org Infrastructure:** Shortly after the last board meeting, the staff concluded their RFP for the Drupal.org infrastructure project. We are happy to announce that the bid was awarded to Tag1 Consulting. Since that time we have onboarded Tag1 and begun the process of migrating infrastructure responsibilities. In the process, Tag1 has already helped us improve and standardize several infrastructure processes. [You can learn more here.](#)
- **Drupal.org tooling improvements:** We've continued to explore tooling options in

consultation with community members and volunteers, including a deep dive exploration at Midwest Drupal Summit. In our last update to the community we mentioned three options under primary consideration: #1) GitHub #2) GitLab #3) Improving existing tools. Since that time we've been able to eliminate GitHub from consideration after conversations with their open source outreach team. Unfortunately GitHub's current corporate policy does not allow organizations to run their own public instances of the platform, so our only option would be to migrate to GitHub.com - a situation that we cannot afford because of the impact it would have on traffic and thus revenue for Drupal.org.

We also introduced a new option into consideration - Atlassian BitBucket. Some advantages this offers over GitLab are automatic upstream syncing, a more mature and stable api, and better handling of git objects in the file-system. (To our own surprise) this has actually made BitBucket the leading contender in our minds, though we still need to complete our prototyping and evaluation.

- **Membership Update:** This year, we saw a decrease in membership renewals. To counter this, we hosted our popular [certificate campaign](#) in July. It reached 100% of goal, bringing in over \$18,000. More importantly, it brought more people closer in touch with the Drupal Association and our mission work. These funds allow us to give DrupalCon scholarships and Community Cultivation Grants, which helps others move Drupal forward around the world.
- **Community Spotlight:** This program was created many years ago to highlight community heroes who go above and beyond to help move the project forward. When the Drupal Association downsized last year, we could no longer keep this program going. We want to give a big thanks to Lyndsey Jackson for starting a committee to bring this program back. We are excited to have these stories shared once again. They inspire all of us. [Learn more here.](#)
- **Community Governance:** In order to help the community self-organize and update their governance, the Drupal Association hired Whitney Hess to help them uncover their governance needs and strategies for achieving those needs. She also worked with the community to create a survey, giving us insight into how the community wants to host a Governance Summit. Results will be coming soon. One thing is clear, the community wants to own the work of moving this community governance work forward rather than have the Drupal Association do it. The CWG, which is part of the community governance, has agreed to take on this role. The CWG will work with the community to determine how to host a Governance Summit. - **Business Community Survey:** We were pleased to work once again with Janne Kalliola and Michel van Velde to promote their 2nd annual business community survey. We are eager to learn how Drupal businesses are doing, what markets are growing, and where businesses should focus their efforts in the new year. [You can learn more here.](#)
