Introduction

This document explains how to install, configure and use MotionPoint Translation Connector modules that integrate with Drupal Version 8 and 9. It also details how to create and submit translation content from Drupal to MotionPoint.

Getting Started

Necessary Items required to complete installation:

- This documentation supports Drupal CMS Version 8 and 9.
- Install MotionPoint Translation Connector (version) from <https://www.drupal.org/project/tmgmt>
- Please contact MotionPoint Support at: support@motionpoint.com to receive the API Username and API ID which will be used to login to MotionPoint's Control Center to retrieve their API key.

Installing MotionPoint Translation Connector

Uploading MotionPoint Connector Package

Choose the provider of your preference. **Note:** D7, D8 and D9 means the version of Drupal that is compatible with the translation management provider module.

On your Drupal site, select **Extend** and click **+ Add new module**

Configure MotionPoint Translation for Drupal

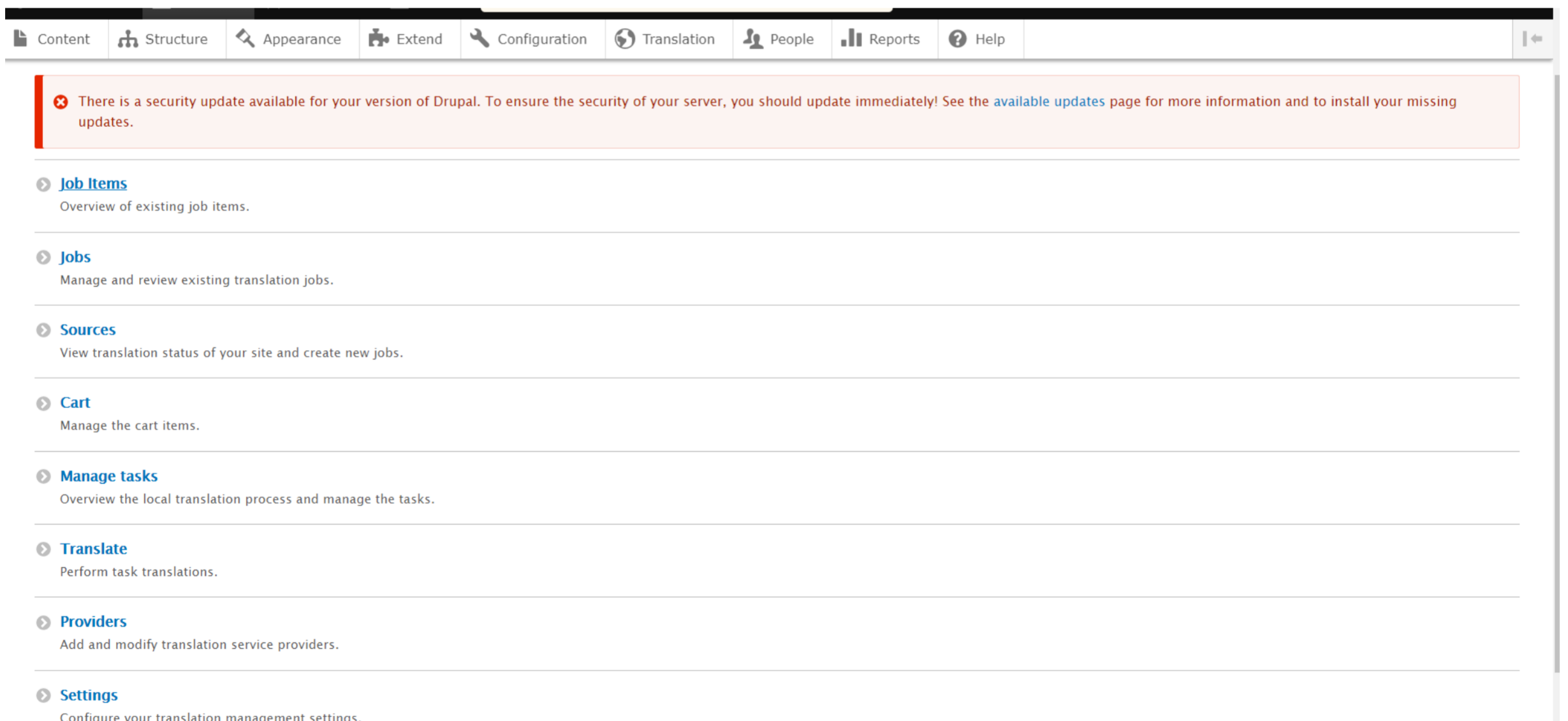
The following steps document how to select MotionPoint as a translation option when submitting your translation request.

NOTE: It's important that this section must be done in the outlined order. If not, issues may arise in the future.

Create MotionPoint Translation Provider Configuration

Click **Translation** menu item.

Then Select the **Providers** link.



After selecting the Providers option, the page will display the list of valid Translation Providers.

Click on **Edit** by MotionPoint provider.

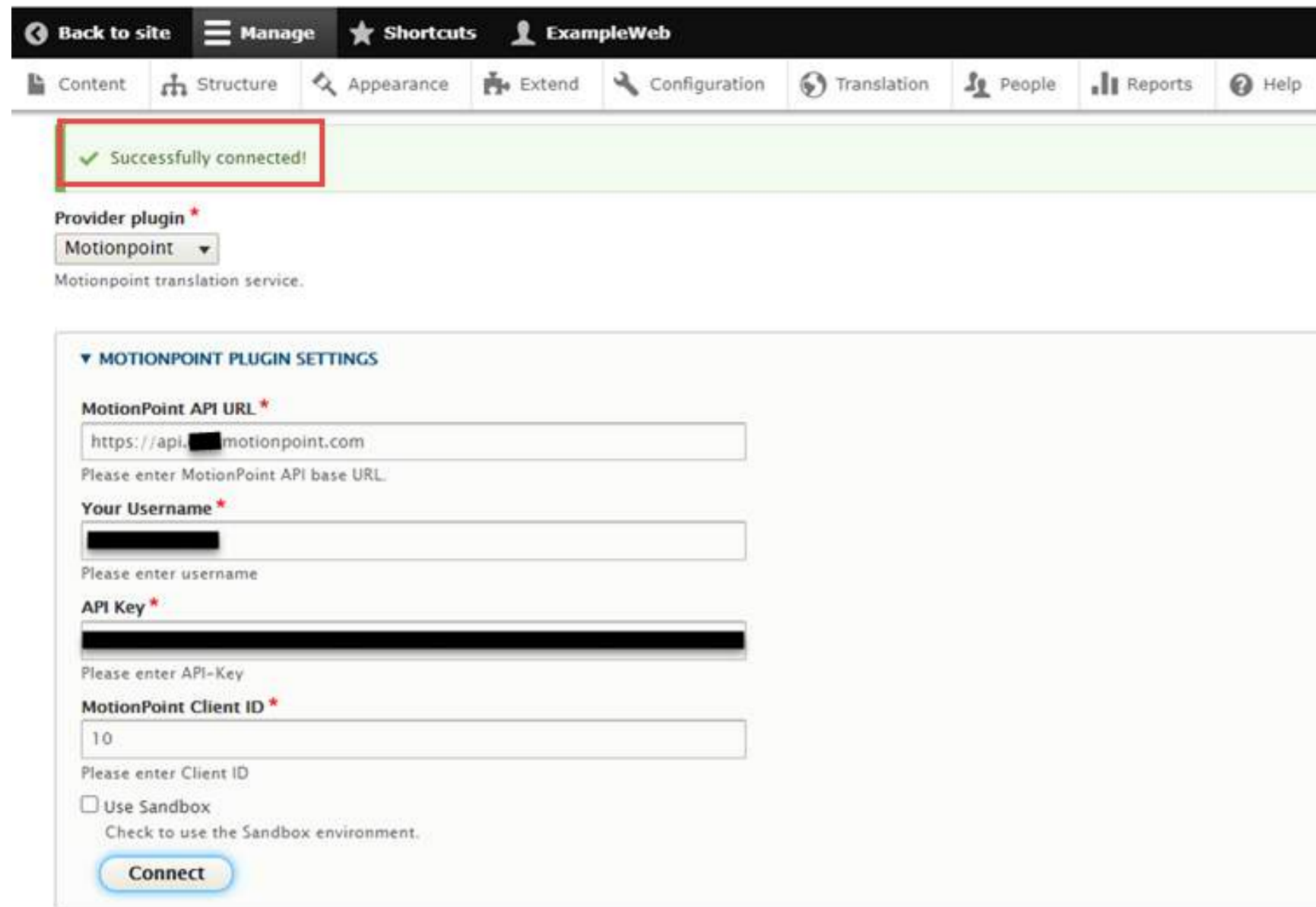

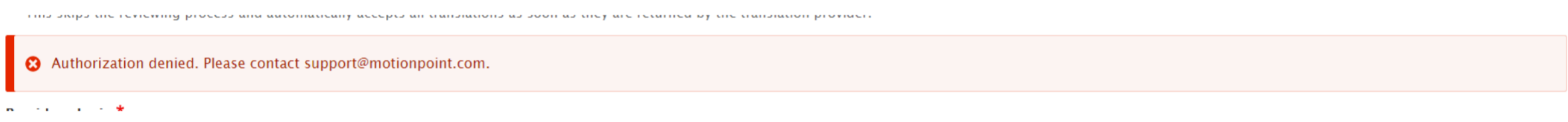

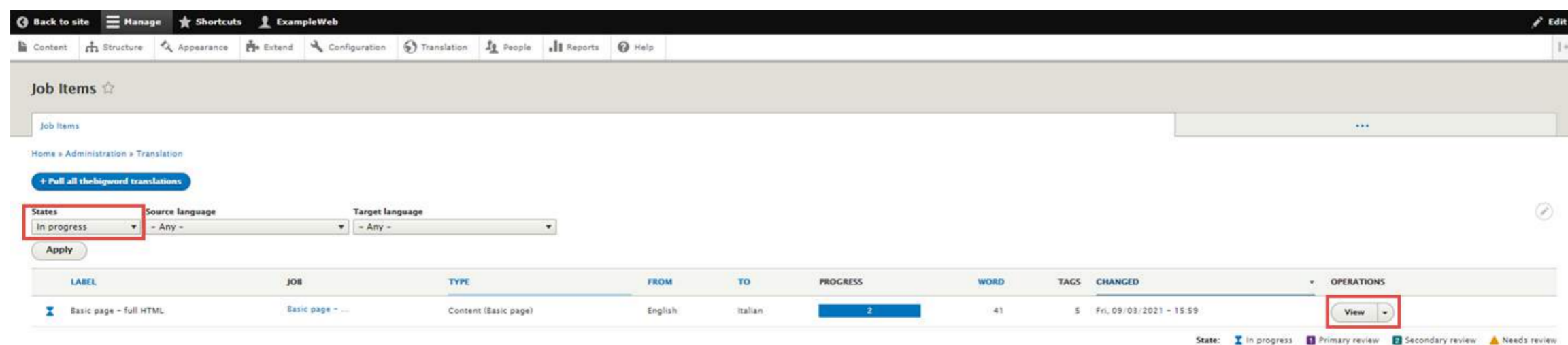


Once the connection with the translation provider is done, you are ready to start translation for any possible content from your Drupal's site. Translation can be done from different Drupal content types: Article and Basic page

Overview of the existing job items

Job Items (Click Translation tab from the Main Menu)

If a translation request has been made to a provider, the job will show up under this screen. Here you can filter the jobs by states, source and target language. Also you can view the job by clicking the view link that is located next to the job or Abort the job.



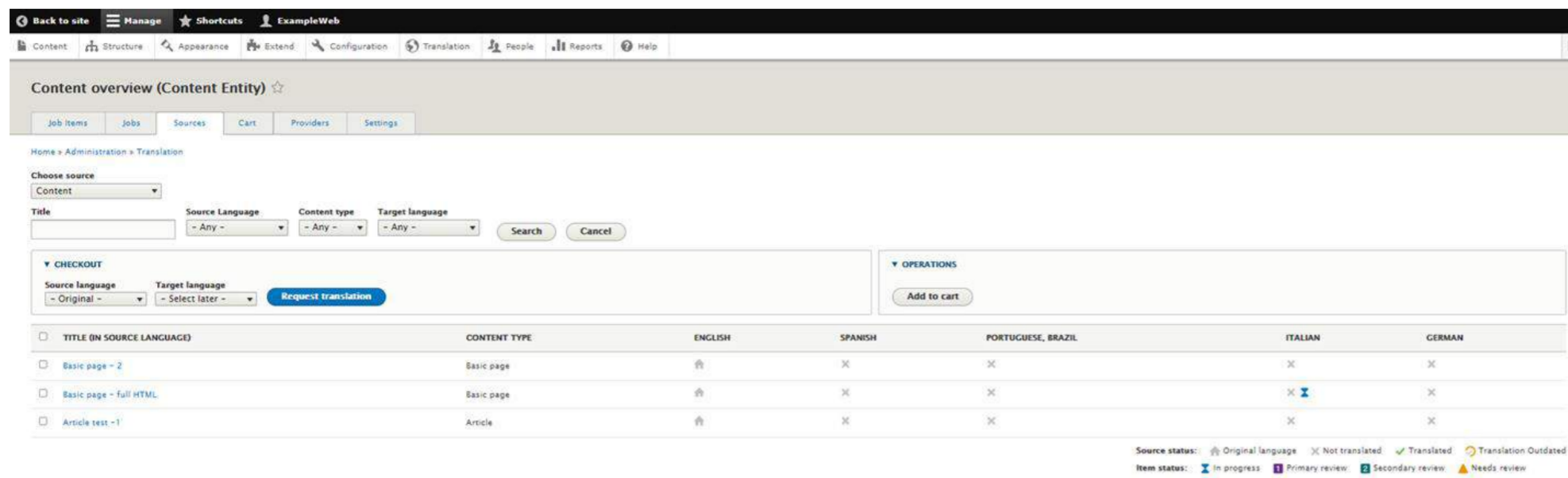
Jobs

Manage and review existing translation jobs. Under this screen, you will find all the translation requests that have been made to a provider. It details the content that was requested for translation, source and target language, the provider, the progress, the number of words that are being translated, etc. It also shows the state of the translation. There are different states: Unprocessed, In progress, Primary review, Secondary review and Needs review. The states will be updated accordingly to match any of the possible options. You can also Manage a job that has been submitted and that is in progress by choosing **Delete** or **Abort** from the Manage drop-down list. Also a job that is under **Unprocessed** progress can be submitted from this screen.

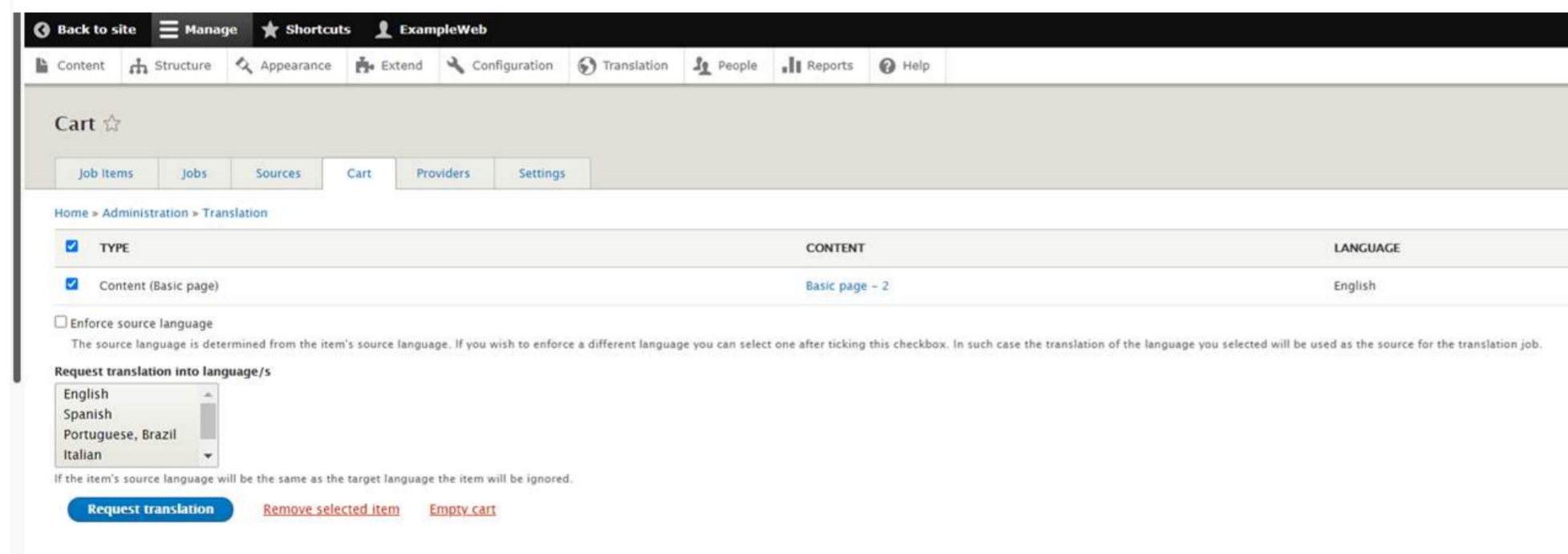
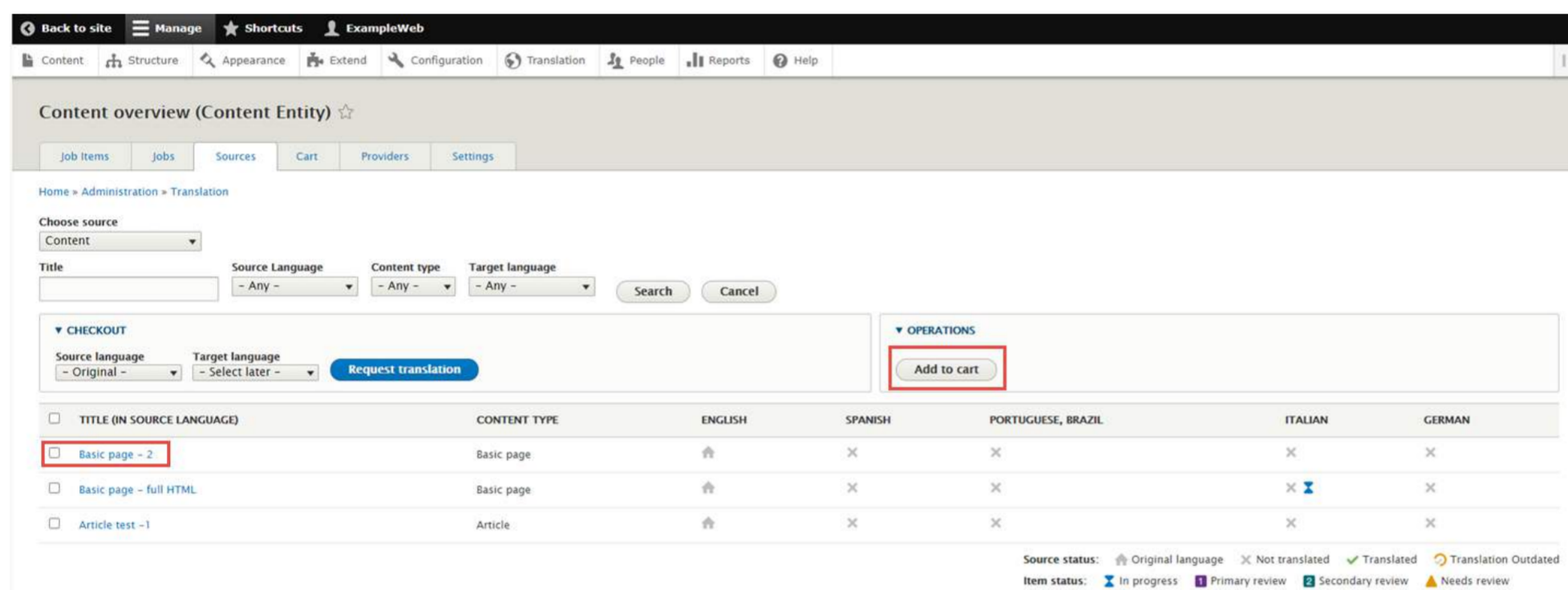
Sources

View translation status of your site and create new jobs. On this screen you can see a list of the content that is available on your Drupal's site and that can be translated. The languages that were added during installation and configuration of TMGMT Drupal show up on this screen. Different source status may show up under each of the available languages: Original language, Not translated, Translated and Translation Outdated. In the case of a content where the translation is in progress, these status may display under the language the content is being translated into: In progress, Primary review, Secondary review or Needs review. These states are configurable.



Cart

All the content that is saved for later translation request can be found on this section. Content can be added to the cart from Sources tab by selecting the content checkbox and clicking the **Add to Cart** button.



Testing the Connector

After you complete the configuration, the MotionPoint Connector is ready for testing. We recommend sending only a few pages for translation, in one language, as an initial test. Once successful, you can send as many languages as required. Please coordinate with your translation provider for this test process.

If you have any concerns or questions, please contact MotionPoint’s Support Team. You must test the end-to-end process, from content creation to publishing, to ensure that the Connector is working as expected and configured to support your business needs.

In addition to following the guidelines below, you should also include any internal test or use cases that would normally be applied to any software that is deployed to the Drupal System. This saves time and project costs, since the process of troubleshooting issues during the production phase is costly and delays your translation timelines.

Recommendations:

- Complete your testing in a pre-production environment before deploying the Connector to your production environment.
- If you must perform testing in your production environment, create test content that can be deleted after completing the tests.
- Consider any changes in functionality, configuration, or customization between pre-production and production environments in this final test pass.

Testing the connector:

1. Verify that the Connector is configured to send all required content types for all required languages.
2. Ensure that the Connector sends only translatable content for translation.

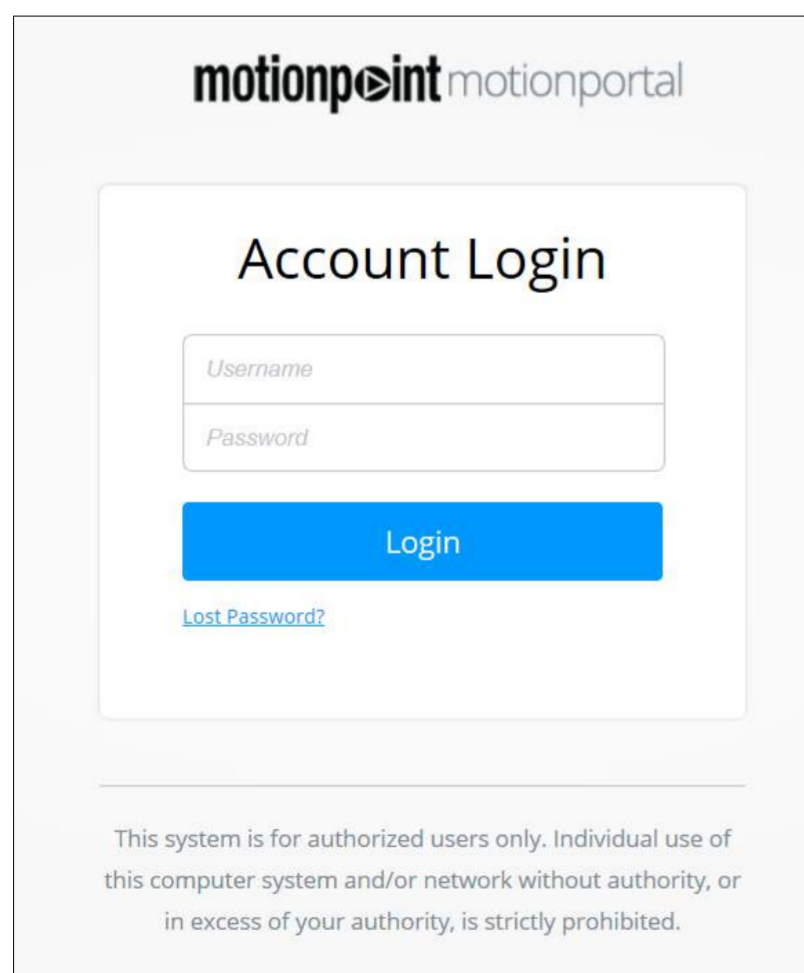

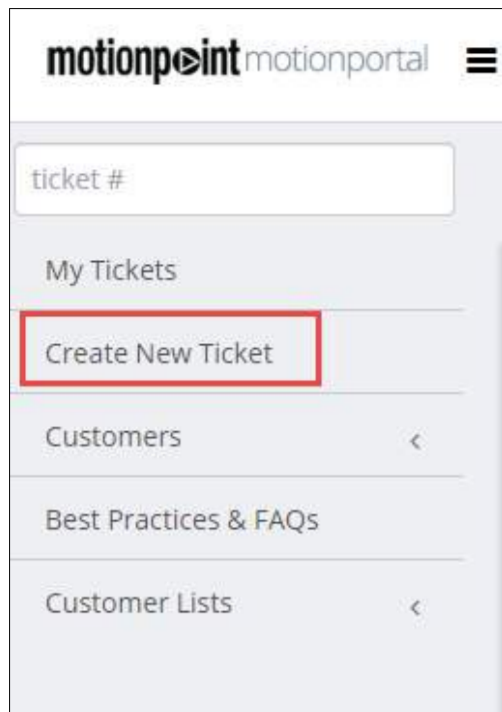
